Homelessness is defined by Housing and Urban Development (HUD) as living outdoors or in a place not intended for human habitation, such as a car.

Housing Insecurity

In addition to the unsheltered count reported to HUD, it is critical to identify those in our community who are housing insecure. This includes those living long-term in area motels as well as school-aged children who are precariously housed (living in motels, doubling up with family or friends, or living in a shelter).







